#### **Tesla Winter tires**

Winter seems to have come a bit early this year. I just put my winter tires on this afternoon, I was trying to hold off, but winter is being very aggressive this year. The Tesla reprograms the TPMS sensors automatically, you push a button and go for a short drive and POOF! It knows what all the tires are doing.

#### **Bolt Winter tires complete.**

I bolted the winter tires on the Bolt October 28th! Jessica was VERY happy that I got to it before the snow hit the fan. Afternoon update, she is still very happy with her tires after all the snow and ice we had Monday night. \$700 well spent.

The last step was having Pep Boys put the TPMS sensors, wheels and tires together. I used Pep Boys because they give a very favorable rate to Tire Rack customers. You HAVE to TELL them you are from Tire Rack though, otherwise you will be paying their regular price. The Tire Rack price is 12.95 per tire = \$51.80 in assembly. I paid \$39.58 on ebay for the set of four TPMS sensors. I paid \$240 for the four wheels from a guy on Craigslist. They are 16" Aluminium wheels from a Chevy Cruze. I paid 436.70 for the tires, and then got a \$70 rebate. This is \$768.08 out of pocket, and then the \$70 back brings a touch under \$700 for a full setup. I haven't driven it in the snow yet, but the feedback from Jessica has been extremely positive. I did this over many months acquiring parts as deals came around. I wouldn't expect anyone to pull that off when the snow is flying though. I could have actually done it cheaper by buying used snow tires and gotten the whole package down to around \$600. I went with new in this case as they weren't drastically more expensive. I will always go used when the price is 50% or less of new assuming the used tires have at least 7/32's of tread all season or 8/32's for winter tires.

The last step is programming the TPMS to the car. You can buy the tool on Amazon for \$10 to \$15 and do it at home whenever you want. I just ran out and did it and it only took a couple of minutes. You work through the on screen menu and push and hold the check mark on the TPMS screen, and say YES you do want to reprogram them. The car lights up the corner lights based on which one you should program. You push the button on the programming tool and hold it near the tire, and then the car honks. You move to the next light and repeat. The car honks twice when complete. There are Youtube videos on the topic if you want video guidance. If anyone needs it done and doesn't want to buy the tool, just come over and we will do it. The same process should also apply to recent Volt's.

# **Encouraging Our Membership To Grow in 2019 and Some History**



#### **Meeting Minutes - OCTOBER**

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Samantha Bingham - Chicago area Clean Cities Coalition update
 Jeff Miller (president) led meeting.

Started with introductions w/ question of the week - "If you're car was crushed tomorrow what would you buy to replace it? What draws you in that direction?"

Many interesting answers were given. Most people would just get a copy of their current car. Jeff & Mike would still get a Tesla Model S/3 respectively. Samantha, who currently doesn't have a car, would get the Leaf Plus. Several people would get a Bolt or BMW i3. There were also a good number of people who would either get an ICE car due to distance needs or would get no car (the best choice overall environmentally). Many people would have chosen the Volt if it was still in production.

Samantha Bingham presented an update on Chicago Area Clean Cities Coalition. Their goal is to reduce petroleum in public transit. They are fuel neutral (advocate for almost all alternative fuels) and focus on fleet solutions. She talked about several of their current/former projects (e.g. Pace uses natural gas for their fleet). The Department of Energy has shifted focus mainly to R&D rather than big projects/funding. ComEd is rumored to start an EV incentive program in the near future. ComEd & Nissan currently offering discount on new Nissan LEAFs (info posted in FVEAA facebook page).

Jeff Miller opened nominations. Howard officially nominated all the current members for their current positions. The nomination was seconded. Tracy was nominated to be a director & the nomination was seconded. Tracy accepted the nomination. Nominations will be open until this November meeting where elections will be held.
