I believe I have mentioned this in the past but this is one of a couple of suspension issues in the front end of the all wheel drive model S and X. To me it looks like a casting issue where the aluminum isn't fully combining before it starts to form crystals at the end of the casting which causes a grain boundary there. I have managed to look at a picture of the failed part on the forums and it looks like a fairly fast failure without a long period of crack propagation which means it would be hard to detect before failure. There have been recalls on the front end before, but I believe they didn't really fix their problems as cars outside the recall have had this failure. Just to reiterate, this doesn't happen with the old rear drive only cars. Those cars have front suspension issues, but just normal ball joint wear, not failing control arms.






