November Meeting

Our first presenter is Ted, who has been at a couple of the meetings recently. He has a Tesla and no home charging, and with that in mind he is going to present his various ways of living with the Tesla without home charging. I am going to present after the break and follow up Simon's discussion on charging infrastructure failures with ways to deal with that on road trips. My experiences will be from the perspective of a Tesla driver, however, if Tesla follows through with making their stations universal this same technique will apply to all vehicles. I will also discuss how to use the new adapter Tesla now sells to plug a Tesla into a 400 volt CCS station. This will include a few references to my recent road trip to the Shawnee National Forest, Atlanta Georgia, New Orleans, and Houston Texas. If I have time I will also give an update on what the cost of electricity was for that trip.

Preparing for winter

I have reorganized and cleaned my garage out enough to get another car in there. The downside to having three cars in there is that the snowblower is behind the third car, so someone has to clear the driveway enough to get the car out to get the snowblower out. It's possible this could be altered when I know snow is coming, but one thing at a time. I just bolted all the snow tires onto the cars. For those of you that have recent Teslas, make sure the pressure in the tires is exactly correct before you try to reset the TPMS (assuming you are putting on snow tires). It seems that they will not reset until the pressure is correct.

Preparing our country for the future

Myself and some others have been having many discussions around how to move forward with electrified transportation. We have also all realized that solar is really cheap, however it's getting to the point of not being economical to install in parts of the country due to the price of electricity falling to nearly zero when the sun is shining. The result of this is that many solar projects are being built with significant battery storage to shift the generated energy out of the peak solar window. This is good news as the solar projects are continuing, however, it raises the effective price of solar energy. The other side of the coin is that most of us currently charge our cars at night at our homes, not during the day when the sun is shining. What we really need is ubiquitous workplace charging. As the cars plug in during the morning hours, they would be able to start pulling in, what is in many places, excess energy from solar. Ideally the cars would be mostly

or completely charged before the afternoon peak cooling demand during the summer. More importantly, the charging stations should be managed to allow the grid operators the most flexibility as to how much they are taking and when. The reality is that our overnight electricity demand, especially in the winter, will climb substantially as we move to heat pumps, and we need to make plans for using existing capacity to meet those demands. Adding solar capacity to meet our car charging demands during the day is an economical way to achieve this. Failing to do this, and continuing to concentrate EV demand into the overnight hours will cause serious headaches for grid operators as we take out Natural Gas.

One of the other big advantages of this is that driving to work is something that many people in disadvantaged communities do. If every parking space where employees park has charging available for approximately the cost everyone pays at home, then it is a win for EV adoption in disadvantaged communities too.

You will notice I am not proposing the employers install it, I am implying the utilities could install it. Just like the residential electrification act set the country up for success, we could put together a law that would pay for charging to be installed by the utilities at every parking spot that could be used by an employee during their work day. The goal here would be to have a robust charging network operated by regional operators and a simple payment method which could be as simple as having your charging appear as a line item to your residential bill, with additional accommodations for commuters. This aligns demand with the supply of cheap solar energy, greatly assists with creating the ability to adopt, and is far cheaper than putting in enough fast chargers to cover all of the people that don't have home charging.
