November Meeting

Thanks to Ted Liu for presenting his various ways of living with a Tesla without home charging. Something I learned was that Hotels.com has the ability to filter for hotel charging, I had always just used Plugshare which also has a filter for lodging. I also discussed my recent trip and where things went well, and how I implemented various strategies that I have learned over the years to make it go smoothly. Hotel charging is great, but it doesn't always work out, so I plan my hotel stays near fast chargers, or at least where I have enough range to reach the next fast charger on my trip from the hotel.

Preparing our country for the future

An acquaintance of mine is trying to put 27 charging stations in a Chicago condo building's parking garage. This building was converted from industrial to condos in 1999, so it is not an old electrical system compared to what it could be. He can't get electrical contractors to take him seriously or even offer a bid. I referred him to Kapital Electric, and even they said it isn't something they do. His issue is the building is out of capacity already, and so his expectation is that the 20+ unit building needs a service addition or upgrade. This is a pretty big task, but a fairly lucrative one. The lack of response is concerning. If anyone knows an electrical contractor who is definitely interested in doing a 27 charging station project in Chicago, let Jeff Miller know. I haven't spoken to the contractors myself, but my guess is they don't want to deal with Comed on expanding the service in the building.

Comed now offers a three tier pricing option

When I checked my account I got the message:

"Your account is currently ineligible because it is already enrolled in a conflicting program." And the cause is:

"Customers with solar panels are required to be on Rider POG (Parallel Operation of Generation Facilities) or Rider POGNM (Net Metering) and are ineligible to participate in Time-of-Day Pricing. Additionally, customers who elect to participate in a community solar project (Rider POGCS) are also ineligible to participate in Time-of-Day Pricing."

One of the advantages compared to Residential Real Time Pricing is you can leave this at any time, with no one year minimum. As usual for Comed though, it might take a few months to make the change. Just be aware that the prices on the comed site right now are the winter prices. Summer prices will be different, and likely much higher for the super peak. This COULD be an improvement from RRTP, however I would really like to see the summer rates published three months in advance of their start, so you can make an informed decision to stay or exit the program before they go into effect. Certainty in pricing is good though, and for that, this is an improvement and could be a real help for some of us.


Perhaps my next project will be investigating and reporting on the latest available EVSE units that home owners can install...



- AC for local driving
 - o Lower power and equipment requirements
 - o Delivery infrastructure already here
 - o Can install more AC plugs for the same cost as a DC unit

Encouraging Our Membership To Grow and Some History


