Geneva, built in 1843, and reportedly the oldest Unitarian church west of New York State.

Our first meeting at this location will be on January 20th beginning at 7 pm. The address is 102 South Second Street, Geneva IL 60134. Parking is on 2nd street or on James Street.

This initial meeting will be downstairs as there is a small folk concert going on at the same time in the sanctuary. Thanks to everyone who ventured out! I had a good time, hopefully everyone else did too.

January Meeting

Ted Liu is returning for the second time in January and he plans to show us how he takes road trips in his Tesla. His strategies are different from mine, so even if you have heard my point of view on road trips, his will be different. He also takes more road trips each year than I do, so I expect to pick up a few tips. Second up we have Tracey McFadden with an overview on Solid State batteries. I haven't heard much news on them lately, so I am curious to hear what he has to say about them. On top of that, we will be meeting for the first time in a new location, and I am excited to see how that goes!

Preparing our country for the future

In case you haven't heard North America built cars qualify for the full \$7500 tax credit until the end of March. This excludes the Kia and Hyundai of course. Tesla's and GM's vehicles are back in the hunt though.

On New Years Eve I passed the EPA 608 Universal exam, so I am now certified to handle refrigerants in the US. As most of you are aware I plan to get rid of my gas furnace this year and take advantage of the IRA tax credit for Heat Pumps. Just FYI, your heat pump has to show up on the Energy Star approved list. This isn't just the outdoor unit, but both the outdoor and indoor unit combined. If you are looking to do a drop in replacement for a gas furnace, then you will need to be very careful to get a combination that is approved, to get the tax credit.

If anyone is wanting to get serious about this, the best advice I can give you is to get a home energy monitoring system that can track the run time on your current furnace before winter ends. If anyone wants help, let me know. By tracking actual furnace run time, having an energy tracking system allowed me to check my actual utilization on that really cold and windy night we had back in December. It caused me to revise my estimates up by about one additional ton of heating capacity. I am looking at 72,000 (6 tons) of heat pump capacity at -10 to keep up with a cold and windy night. That is a pretty big install, and I haven't settled on exactly how I am going to get there yet. The ceiling area I insulated last winter performed quite well. There are a few corners that leak more than I would like, but I can't get at them without removing drywall.

I will say that my experience with my Tesla on Christmas Eve wasn't that every Tesla station worked. It was quite cold and three of the older stations with thick cables weren't staying on their hooks. Then they would fall nose down into the snow. The heat from charging would melt and then refreeze the snow, and that was the end of that. My luck with the 250kw stations was better. It's possible they are using the liquid cooling system to keep the pins warm enough not to freeze? Or that was just luck.






